Navsanjeevan social trust strives to build an equitable and egalitarian society. We aim to alleviate poverty by empowering the next generation with Skill Education. We work on diminishing the skill gap that exists in the present world, by making youth market-ready. Navsanjeevan aims to build a healthy, vibrant, and dynamic society by empowering youth through skill education and providing sustainable employment/self-employment relevant to the market needs

Objective:

- 1) Skill Education - To address the educational needs of youth and to provide an academic education, training, and job-oriented skill education, to specific age groups for the overall development and make them self-reliant.
- 2) Women Empowerment - To Work for the social and economic development of women through self-help groups the training to empower them for self-sustainability.

Current activities are undertaken by the organization:

Skill Development:

Navsanjeevan social Trust starts the new program Kushal Yuva program in Pune district, Maharashtra. To enhance the employability skills of all aspirants in the age group of 15-28 years. Most of the girls and boys trained are from informal worker families who have limited/ no access to such opportunities. The program offers them to complete Trust. Certified course in skill education in a set curriculum. One year 560 students completed the program.

VOCATIONAL & HANDICRAFT TRAINING PROGRAMME OF THE WOMEN SELF HELP GROUP: -

Keeping in the mind the objectives of removal of poverty by reducing the problem of employment, the trust has started a vocational training program. In this training program, women and youth are provided training in different fields like knitting & tailoring, and a beauty parlor with a total of 378 women completed their course in the Year 2021. Ten training programs were organized by Navsanjeevan, the members

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appreciated this program very much. The meeting was closed with a vote of thanks to the chairperson. Nine women started the small business of tailoring and beauty Parlor units.

The Goat Farming Project: -

The Goat farming project encourages effective and sustainable goat rearing practices in Maharashtra. the program provides training and support to women identified as goat rearers known as Usha Chavan, helping them earn an income by way of preparing and selling goat feed supplements and treatment of goats. Around 35 women start the goat farming 875 goats.
